Ohio Energy Project



- Q: When will I be notified if I am selected as a participant?
A: The first round of selections will be made by March 10, 2008. You will be notified by March 24 if you were selected or placed on the wait list. Applications will continue to be accepted as spots remain.
- Q: How do you select participants?
A: Priority will be given to the following teachers:
- 1st time participants.
 - 5th-12th grade Ohio science, environmental or technology teachers. A small number of special education and/or social studies teachers may be selected. Only two teachers per school district will be chosen.
 - Participants in the electric service territory of our sponsors.
- Q: What is the cost for the Energy Sources Tour?
A: Transportation, meals and lodging are FREE! If selected, you will be asked for a \$25 deposit to hold your spot, but it will be returned at the end of your Tour. Your deposit is only forfeited if you cancel 30 days or less prior to the trip departure date.
- Q: How much graduate credit is available and how much does it cost?
A: Two or four quarter hours from Ohio University at \$85 per quarter hour.
- Q: What sites will we be visiting?
