2012 Central Ohio Energy Sources Tour

Q: When will I be notified if I am selected as a participant?

A: Registration will be open until March 23rd. You will be notified by March 28th if you were selected or placed on the wait list. Applications will continue to be received as spots remain available after March 23rd.

Q: How do you select participants?

A: Priority will be given to the following teachers:

- 1st time participants (2nd time participants will NOT be accepted)
- 5th-12th grade Ohio science teachers
- Teachers in the electric service territory of our sponsors
- One teacher per school and/or school district

Q: What is the cost for the Energy Sources Tour?

A: Transportation, meals and lodging (double occupancy) are FREE! If selected, you will be asked for a \$100 deposit to hold your spot, but it will be returned at the end of the Tour. Your deposit is only forfeited if you cancel 30 days or less prior to the trip departure date.

PLEASE NOTE: The deposit is not due until you are accepted. Please **DO NOT** send it with your application.

Q: How much graduate credit is available and how much does it cost?

A: Two semester hours from Ashland University at a cost of \$300. A course syllabus will be included with your confirmation packet.
